## President's Report 2021/2022

This season will not be remembered for on-field glory but I am very pleased with how the club is tracking 3 years into my Presidency and look forward to converting our off-field successes onto the field. Our 2021 off-season saw some new challenges for the committee with our expansion into the preparation and maintenance of our turf facilities. We finalised negotiations with the City of Subiaco to take over the curating of Rosalie Park with Josh Marrs to take on the role of curator but our battle for College Park was still ongoing. After 3 years of meetings, hundreds of pages of correspondence, years of sub-standard turf facilities we finally won our battle in a fiery Council meeting. Thanks go to Club Secretary Rob Brierley, Past Presidents in David Morey/Michael Davis, new club curator Josh Marrs as well as our committee as a whole who helped get that over the line. A lot of effort went into the arduous process, spanning multiple Presidents and I hold this win as high as any premiership I have won.

Our AGM saw a large jump in committee numbers with Deven Vaswani on board as Treasurer and Alex Ford running our KlubPro content. Women's Rep Courtney Zyrucha recruited several ladies onto committee including Natalie Morris who stepped into the Merchandise role as we continued to expand our clubs inventory. Hannah Bodycoat ran our first ever Women's Day which was a wonderful event and Elizabeth Bodycoat took control of the large workload running our clubs social media. Along with our returning committee I think we really started to share the work and it was great working with such wonderful individuals.

Club Sponsors REVO Cricket really helped us out this year with the donation of a bowling machine and cage for College Park. With the increased numbers at trainings this was extremely useful to help rotate nets along with our 4 turf nets. Revo Cricket were also very accommodating, providing us with a new pre-season timeslot of 7-9pm, down from 8:30pm starts. Another new addition was to our coaching team in Daniel Gollan. Dan did a fantastic job coaching our Women's team the previous season and Luke Baker was keen to get him working with the young talent coming through.

Our ladies team expanded into a program as we recruited several quality new players as well as new coaches in Leah Morrison and Harry Williams. Team Captains in Kiah Hodgkinson and Courtney Zyrucha did an excellent job fielding 2 teams every single week with the help of Alex Bell and Alex Ford on the sidelines. Leah was recruited as head coach for our ladies which was another large off-field win as she brings a wealth of experience having coached at high levels and worked at the WACA. Harry Williams was unfortunately diagnosed with cancer during the winter break, but even with this setback he completed his level 1 coaching accreditation and coached whenever he could amongst chemo treatments. I am extremely pleased to say his scans are all clear and cannot wait to see him back in action on the field!

This season saw a massive growth in player numbers which seems to build from year to year. We fielded 8 Saturday sides with Sanjay Mukhedkar leading our new team in One Day 3s and thanks to the hard work of Graeme Chinnery we fielded our first ever Veterans team. This team was Captained by David Stead who did an excellent job and thanks go to everyone involved. This was not the case for officials as an association wide shortage of umpires meant that we would be without umpires for our 2<sup>nd</sup> XI and our Women's games unless we provided umpires ourselves. Fortunately for us, our injured players and volunteers really stepped up as David Zeitsch, Brad Nairn and Alex Ford all helped out during the year.

As we took over curating at College in October, we continued with Turf Care preparing the wickets with a new Curator in Daniel Berry. He did an excellent job which saw the pitch ratings rise from 5.6 the previous year to 8.4 but it was most pleasing to hear from players just how big the difference was from one year to the next. Thanks must go to Daniel as well as the management at Turf Care in Michael Maartensz and Cameron Sutherland who were extremely supportive and professional in what was a steep learning curve for myself. Supplementing Turf Care we had our Curating Assistants in

It seemed fitting that two of the people who gave so much of their time into the whole process were able to reap the rewards of quality wickets. The week that we signed the agreement with the City of Nedlands, Michael Davis (113) and I (141) shared a record 218 run 5<sup>th</sup> wicket partnership (after being 5/86) which was my biggest personal highlight of the season. This partnership was soon surpassed as Jason Kalamaras and Chad Paull blasted a record 311 run partnership in 40 overs against Bedford-Morley. This was a sign of things to come as Jason blasted 920 runs @77 and finally convinced his family in the team to give him the votes required to take out his first Gibbney award.

The season was unfortunately shortened again due to the learning from COVID impacted seasons from associations over east. WASTCA made the call to shorten all games after Christmas to one dayers which allowed us to play every team at least once and also fit in finals. Our only side making the grand final was our Colts side who setup a rematch against South Perth but again could not get the job done. The pleasing factor is that every one of our Colts players will be playing next year too!

During the season we saw the debuts of Riley Waters, Liam Gollan and Mark De Swardt. Max Bailey and Lachlan Dargie made strong contributions in their first full season of First XI cricket. Matt Horton had his best season to date in the 1's and Jack Trotter showed himself and the club that he is a capable player at this level.

New to the club last season Matt George was an impressive addition to our side and we welcomed back the experience and passion of Stuart Peterson.

If you do not judge our season through the lens of wins and losses, I think we walk away very satisfied in achieving what we wanted to in the development and exposure of these players. However, the reality is when we get to finals time and we were not part of it, we are left with the very bitter taste of disappointment.

The fact remains that that so many of our seasons are plagued by the curse of not winning matches early in the season and this season was no different.

Round 1 begun with a forgettable loss away to Bassendean. Sent in on a good cricketing day we were bundled out in the 34<sup>th</sup> over for 73 with only 3 players and extras making it to double figures. Bassendean chased them down in the 23<sup>rd</sup> over, Matt George bowled well only conceding 18 from his 8 overs but 73 was never going to be enough. (WS 74, Marrs 21; B 3/74, George 2/18).

Forced to play our first home game of the season on the western wicket of College we were again invited to bat first. We posted 197 from our 40 overs thanks to an impressive late hitting display from Lachie Dargie. 3 early wickets to Max Bailey had Applecross 3/13 before their number 5 made an impressive century. Great bowling from Dan Gollan and Josh Marrs brought us back into the match, and really into a position that we should have won from however a 42 run 8<sup>th</sup> wicket partnership and some drop catches ultimately saw Applecross get across the line in the 39<sup>th</sup>, 9 wickets down. (WS 9/197, Dargie 86, Baker 40; A 9/198, Bailey 3/34).

Away for the first 2-day match of the season came in round 3 against Curtin Victoria Park. Winning the toss for the first time since 2020 we chose to field. On a docile pitch and a slow outfield, it was a slow moving grind of a day. Stu Peterson made his return for the club picking up 2/32 from his 16 disciplined overs. Marrs also took 2 and Matt George took 3. We returned on week 2 confident that if we batted the day we would chase down CVP's 200. Opening the batting Liam Gollan and Alex Bell put on 51 and set the foundation for the day. Baker and Marrs both completed half-centuries in their partnership of 92 and Dargie joined the openers in making it to 20. (CVP 200, George 3/39; WS 3/204, Marrs 68, Baker 53\*).

Round 4 I won the toss then lost the toss when the umpire demanded a do-over and Whitfords elected to bat. Steady wickets throughout the first part of the day kept us well positioned in the contest until an 8<sup>th</sup> wicket partnership catapulted their score to 280. With the confidence from

It was at the break that Trotter made the claim that he always gets his mate Coles out, impressed by his confidence Trotter was given first crack after the break and duly nicked his mate off which lead to one of the more outrageous celebrations ever seen at College. Trotter picked up another one soon thereafter and we thought we were on our way. But in what was seeming to become a pattern a late order partnership and a very impressive innings by the number 8 almost coughed up the points. Marrs took 6/21 and De Swardt 3/11. We knocked them off in 16 overs, Peterson was not out 38 and Mark De Swardt after 3 attempts had his first run in the 1s. Round 9 again at home and winning the toss this time against Kalamunda we batted first. A typical Lefroy 50 got us off to a flyer unfortunately the middle order did not fire and when we were 5/70 and 7/100 our total was going to be well under par. Thanks to an enterprising

## HISTORY of WESTERN SUBURBS CRICKET CLUB

**1964 – 65** In mid – winter of 1964 Michael Worner was advised if we could get a team together we could join the Western Australian Suburban Turf Cricket Association.

After a meeting at the Highway Hotel in August 1964 between Michael Worner, Michael Maye, Paul Olivier and Peter Beck, the club was born.

We chose the name “Collegians” and entered the competition in 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade (there were only two grades). Our first game was against Teachers who became Shenton Park years later.

It is now history that under Peter Ridley our team went through the season undefeated and won a thrilling final against Subiaco in March 1965.

The team to play in the final was in batting order Michael Worner (vc) 3, Peter Beck 4, Neville Eastman 108, Don Efford 17, Peter Ridley (c) 3, Pat Dullard 47, Philip Newton 10, John Farrer 4, Barry Newton 38, Tim McComish 12, John Worner 4no Total 266 .  
Subiaco City 252. P Newton 4/54, J Farrer 2/34, T McComish 1/31, P Ridley 2/22, J Worner 1/14

Our first training venue was the practice wickets at the St Louis College and our home ground was St Louis Oval. \*\*\*\*

**1965 – 66** The team was promoted to 1<sup>st</sup> Grade and achieved moderate success and finished fifth.

**1966 – 67** The Club entered a second team in the competition captained by Michael Worner, whilst the 1<sup>st</sup> Grade was captained by Neville Eastman.

During this season we were forced to change training venues to the practice wickets at Claremont Oval and in order to gain council support we changed our name to Claremont. Our second side reached the semi-final.

**1967 – 70** The Club continued to grow and negotiations were underway with Nedlands City Council to secure Graylands Oval as a second home ground (St Louis Oval was our home ground and also then our training venue).

**1970 – 71** The club entered a third team captained by Michael Maye in the competition. and gained Graylands Oval as our training venue and second home ground. Practice wickets were built by the club at Graylands.

**1971 – 72** Each of the clubs three sides (in first, third and fifth grades) reached the finals but lost. Ian Lyon and Peter Blake scored “one day” tons on a limited overs basis. Michael Barker achieved a “hat trick” in a one day game against Swanbourne in First Grade – the Club’s first.

**1972 – 73** A fourth side captained by Sam Percy was entered into the competition At the Clubs annual dinner, held at the Sundowner (a home for the aged!) the speaker was John Inverarity. Frank Newton achieved a “hat trick” against Nedlands.

**1973 – 74** This was the most successful year for the club when all four teams reached the semi-finals. Each of the sides in 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Grade won the semi finals and created a record with the club having four sides in the finals.

However the only side to win was the “All Stars” in 6<sup>th</sup> grade, captained by Sam Percy. The club became famous (or infamous) in the town of Augusta. The “All Stars” on tour in the town provided the town with its first “streaker” Bill Harris’. The team in batting order: Jerry Linsten, Peter Beck, Peter Blake (vc), Rod Reid, Alan Holt (wk), David Hyde, Sam Percy (c) Alan Harris, Paul Olivier, David Percy, Colin Beck, and Bernie Masters 12<sup>th</sup> man\*\*\*\*

## CLUB HISTORY (2<sup>ND</sup> Page)

**1974 – 75** 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Grades reached the semi-finals and the “All Stars” reached the finals again to be played against Greenwood at Haig park. Rain unfortunately washed out play and Greenwood having been on top were declared Premiers. Hat tricks were achieved by Greg Calcutt and Jerry Linsten.

**1975 – 76** A fifth side was entered into the competition. The club then had a side in each of the Grades 1 to 5 but only Grade 5 made the finals and lost. 1<sup>st</sup> Grade finished second last and was relegated. During the winter of 1975 the club finalised negotiations with Nedlands Suburban Turf Club (who only had one side in the competition) to amalgamate and the club changed its name to Nedlands. College Park was secured as home ground for our top grades with Graylands being our second home ground.

**1976 – 77** The club reduced the number of sides from five to four as costs were too high in fielding five sides. It was the first time since 1965 that the club did not have a first grade. Jerry Linsten scored a century. Peter Gale took 5 wickets for 2 and Ken Smithson in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade finished the season with 60 wickets at a average of 10.9.

**1977 – 83** During the period we saw the club re-enter first grade and fielding three other teams from third to seventh grades. Success had been limited with the odd team reaching the semi-finals but no pennant coming our way. The club moved from Graylands to College Park for training and in the 1982-83 season secured Dalkeith Hall as its Club Rooms. Two brilliant “hat tricks” were achieved in this period by Peter Gale and Alan Harris (Alan’s were 3LBW’s).

**1983 - 84** The season was the most significant to date in the the history of the club. The season was notable for the premiership won by Mark Quenby’s 5<sup>th</sup> Grade team, the complete establishment of the club at Dalkeith Oval with its club rooms, new synthetic turf pitch and practice facilities and importantly the influx of talented new members into the club. Regrettably, the 1<sup>st</sup> Grade was relegated to 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade and 7<sup>th</sup> Grade performed well through the season and finished close to the four.

**1984 – 85** The club continued to grow on and off the field. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade team was “Grade Winners” and therefore promoted to 1<sup>st</sup> Grade for 1985-86. 7<sup>th</sup> Grade qualified for the finals also, winning the semi-final against City Beach but losing the final to Hamersley. The club completed its improved practice facilities with the addition of a third net and purchased a bowling machine. The club fielded for the first time two junior 12 year old teams. It was a successful season with two teams in the finals and two individual association trophy winners in P Gason and A Hunt. The club streamlined its administration with the introduction of a Board of Directors (8)

**1985 – 86** Further Progress: A Premiership to our 2<sup>nd</sup> XI in 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade. Introduction of another junior team – the under 14's. The club employed an Executive Officer, Alf Dolling. The season saw the club with teams in 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Grades for the first time in its history. The 1<sup>st</sup> Grade side performed admirably, finishing third in its first year back in 1<sup>st</sup> Grade. The club finished fifth in the Association Club Championships (the highest position ever held in the history of the club).

**1986 – 87** Our 2<sup>nd</sup> XI premiers again! This time in 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade. Andrew Quenby as captain enters the record books as the only captain in the club to have lead the team to two Premierships – consecutive ones at that. Campbell Thompson has achieved a club record – the only player to have played in three Premiership finals.

The efforts over the years of Paul Wyndham and Graham Scott culminated in the 12's and 14's being in the finals with the 12's winning the premiership. Overall a good year for the club despite the lack of success in 1<sup>st</sup> Grade.

**1987 – 88** The club did not succeed in reaching the finals in any Grade. The highlights of the season: Paul Wyndham's under 12's second consecutive Premiership and Arther Dowson's under 14's first Premiership.

**1988 – 89** The 5<sup>th</sup> Grade team played in the final, however were not successful. A notable performance during the season was that of the 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Captain, Jeff Zampatti in scoring a club record of 155 runs, undefeated.

**1989 – 90** This season saw the introduction of a 5<sup>th</sup> side for the club in 9<sup>th</sup> Grade. The overall strength of the club was shown through the fact that 4 of the 5 sides made it to the finals with two of the sides, 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Grades making it to the Grand Final. Both of these sides were in winning positions when rain washed out play resulting in only the 9<sup>th</sup> Grade being declared Premiers – a magnificent achievement in their inaugural year under the leadership of Peter Beck.\*\*\*\*

**1990 – 91** The 8<sup>th</sup> Grade won the grand final and the 6<sup>th</sup> grade was beaten in the semi-final after finishing the home and away games undefeated. 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Grades narrowly missed making the finals. Peter Beck achieved a feat of playing in four winning Grand Final Sides.\*\*\*\*

This year Nedlands were second in the Association's Champion Club (less than one win from taking the title from our neighbours, Wembley).

**1991 – 92** Two sides reached the finals, 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade lost the Grand Final and 4<sup>th</sup> Grade lost the semi-final. 1<sup>st</sup> Grade were relegated to 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade and 5<sup>th</sup> Grade to 6<sup>th</sup> Grade.

**1992 – 93** Changes to the Association's rules saw our 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade side that played in the previous years Grand Final moved to 4<sup>th</sup> Grade. This side finished on top of the ladder but lost the Semi – Final. No other sides reached the finals, however our 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade side performed well, failing by a fraction of one point to make it to the finals.



## CLUB HISTORY (4<sup>TH</sup> Page)

**1993 – 94** A new concept of 9<sup>th</sup> Grade this season where the matches were played as one day fixtures of 35 overs. 17 fixtures were played and 8 teams competed in the finals. Our 9<sup>th</sup> Grade won their quarter-final but unfortunately missed out in the semi. These one day fixtures proved to be very popular as it allowed some of our veterans to take an occasional break. Due to the excellent performances during the year the 9<sup>th</sup> Grade were able to enlist the services of former great veteran players to compete in one of the home games. Although still displaying outstanding skills were narrowly defeated.

Andrew Quenby in scoring a century joined Jerry Linsten and Phil Whitely as the only one day players to score 100 and take a hat trick.

**1994 – 95** In an effort to bolster the club's playing strength and return to the 1<sup>st</sup> Grade the club employed a coach, Piran Holloway from England. Unfortunately, the top side was not successful in making the finals, however, the second XI made the Grand Final but lost.

**1995 – 96** Piran Holloway returned to the club as captain/coach, along with another English player Mike Spicer. The performance of our top side improved on last year, narrowly missing out on the finals. No side in the club played finals cricket. The club's financial position was strengthened with good sponsorship during the season.

**1996 – 97** For the third year the first XI missed out on the four by the narrowest of margins. The second XI finished third but lost the semi-final. The club continued its close affiliation with Somerset Cricket Club attracting two more English players for the season.

Sadly, Peter (Stormy) Gale passed away early in the season.

**1997 – 98** This year marked the Golden Anniversary of the Club, after it was realized that in 1975-76 there had been an amalgamation with Nedlands Suburban Turf Cricket Club that had a history dating back to 1947. Only three sides were fielded this season with Ninth Grade withdrawing after the WASTCA decided to abandon the One Day Competition. No side made the finals.

**1998 – 99** In the largest step our club has taken, it was decided to merge with the Claremont Nedlands WACA club, a move to attract youth and numbers to the club. One side made the finals – after a year in mothballs – the 10<sup>th</sup> Grade and went on to win the premiership.

**1999 – 00** The year did not produce much success with only the tenth grade again playing off in the finals. A lot of younger members are on our playing lists and some showed a great deal of promise.

Two outstanding features of the season were 10<sup>th</sup> Grade's Brett House hitting centuries in four consecutive innings and Darren Morley returning from service in Timor to take 6 wickets for 7 runs! Steve Oxley won the Association batting averages in 4<sup>th</sup> Grade, and Brett House in 10<sup>th</sup> Grade

**2000 – 01** The club did not succeed in reaching the finals in any of the four grades it had teams in. Although numbers were up, the quality to be successful in the higher grades were not there. Kent county cricketer Rob Key was the shining light in the 1<sup>st</sup> XI with two centuries and winning the Association batting averages in 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade. Rod Leach became the third player to play 250 games for the club and Larry Dunne took 6 wickets for 2 runs in an outstanding individual performance. On the same day, Graeme Chinnery took 8 wickets for 10 runs. From this season onwards we commenced supplying players for the the W.A.C.A masters competition

**2001 – 02** The one-day side won the premiership in a nail-biting final, after dominating the competition all year. Man of the match, John Holt, fulfilled his boyhood dream of winning a premiership. All the clubs other sides missed out on finals, finishing either 8<sup>th</sup> or 9<sup>th</sup> on their respective ladders. During the season, the club individual innings batting record was beaten first by Quentin Briers (179, 4<sup>th</sup> Grade) and then by Chad Paull (206 not out, One Day Grade) on the same day. Brian Heibner became the fourth player to play 250 games for the club.
